



Little boxes all the same


There's a green one and a pink one And a blue one and a yellow one And they're all made out of ticky tacky And they all look just the same

And they came out all the same



"But" considerations

- small container for small events (minor tech)
- not an archive or book repository like other libraries
- not hosted by a "for-profit" type of educational institution, yet within the universe of being fit for state's subjection (the need and shape of critique is more subtle)
- "we" is not everyone (accessibility politics)
